


I am a Math Person

When asked to picture a mathematician, many children imagine an older white man solving complicated equations. But being a mathematician is about being curious, thinking logically, and making sense of the world. Every time you solve a problem, notice patterns, explain your thinking, or try a new strategy, you are a mathematician!

Suggested Steps:

- Talk with your child about what it means to be a math person (remember, EVERYONE is a math person).
- Have your child complete the sentence starter: "I am a math person because..."
- If your child is stuck use the ideas bank to help get them started.
- Have your child draw a picture of themself as a mathematician.
